

# HOLY EUCHARIST with the Ordination, Consecration & Enthronement of the Reverend Sean Alexander John Semple to be the Sixth Bishop of the Anglican Diocese of Cyprus & the Gulf



Six o'clock Friday, 24th May 2024



#### The Consecration and Ordination of a Bishop

The ministry of the Church is the ministry of Christ, its chief shepherd and high priest. Those who are ordained are called to share Christ's work: to speak in his name and build up the Church of which Christ is the head. This service of ordination perpetuates a pattern of ministry in direct continuity — through a long line of succession – with the apostles. Just as Jesus commissioned his first disciples, so by the laying on of hands the new bishop is commissioned to witness to the resurrection and to preach the good news of salvation in all the world. The particular role of a bishop – while remaining a deacon and priest – is to proclaim and guard the faith, to preside at the sacraments, to lead the Church's prayer and to hand on its ministry. During the service, the candidate will be asked to confirm his commitment to these priorities. All who are present will be asked to undertake to support the ordination of this candidate, not least because as bishop he will act not just on behalf of particular local Christian communities, but of the whole Church. This is followed by the invocation of the Holy Spirit and the laying on of hands. Sean will be anointed with sacred oil, signifying his role of leadership within the royal priesthood of Christ's people; he will receive a copy of the Holy Scriptures, both to remind him of his duty to proclaim the Gospel and of the centrality of God's Word; and he will receive a Pastoral Staff, symbolising his sharing in the ministry of Christ the Good Shepherd. Christ's mission is the fundamental and unifying reality for all ministry. It turns the Church outwards towards the world that God loved so much that he sent his only Son. It prepares the Church for that goal and end of all things, when Christ himself will present to the Father a world made perfect by his work – when all God's people share in the joyful communion of love that binds the Father and the Son, in the unity of the Holy Spirit.

#### The Installation or Enthronement

Once consecrated and vested in his robes and in possession of the symbols of office, the new Bishop Sean will process out of the Cathedral by the South Door, while the West Door is closed. He will knock to be admitted to his Cathedral, and be welcomed by the Dean and Bahraini dignitaries. He will then be led to be installed in the *Cathedra* (the Episcopal Throne) of this Cathedral, a symbol of his taking up of his episcopal office in this Diocese. At this point, Bishop Sean

becomes the celebrant of the Holy Eucharist, and offers words of greeting and a dedication to partnership to representatives of the Kingdom of Bahrain, the Diocesan clergy, Ecumenical Representatives and leaders of other faiths.

#### The Anglican Diocese of Cyprus and the Gulf

Established in 1976, the Anglican Diocese of Cyprus and the Gulf is one of the three dioceses that make up the Episcopal/Anglican Province of Jerusalem and the Middle East, whose Archbishop is currently the Most Rev'd Dr. Hosam Naoum. Geographically, the diocese includes Cyprus, the Sultanate of Oman, the United Arab Emirates, Qatar, Bahrain, Kuwait, Iraq and the Yemen. The diocese is divided into two archdeaconries, that of Cyprus and the Gulf, with two cathedrals, St Paul's in Nicosia, Cyprus, and St Christopher's, in Bahrain. In 1984 the diocese established companion links with the Diocese of Exeter in England and in 2005 with the Diocese of Thika in Kenya. In addition to its many parishes, the diocese is also host to a substantial and growing Mission to Seafarers ministry.

#### Biography of the Bishop Elect: Sean Semple

Sean has served in three provinces of the Anglican Communion. He was ordained priest in the Diocese of Natal in 2011 following a decade of ordained ministry in the Presbyterian Church in Southern Africa. He served in the Diocese of Cyprus and the Gulf as Assistant Priest at St Helena's, Larnaca and moved from there to the Diocese of Hereford, England in 2015, where he was appointed Rector of the Benefices of Weobley and Staunton. In 2019 he was collated to Rector of the Benefice of Ross with Walford and Brampton Abbotts, and served as Rural Dean of the Deanery of Ross and Archenfield from 2020 until 2023. He will be the first African-born Bishop of the Diocese, and the first to be consecrated in the Gulf.

Sean's undergraduate studies in Psychology and Theology were undertaken at the University of Natal and the University of South Africa, followed by post-graduate studies in Spirituality and Clinical Psychology at the University of KwaZulu-Natal and the University of Nicosia respectively. During his time in Cyprus, Sean was also employed by World Vision, an ecumenical Christian humanitarian aid, development, and advocacy organisation, to provide pastoral support to its employees in the Middle East and Eastern Europe region. Sean is married to Jenny and they have five children and one grandchild.

#### **Archbishop Hosam Naoum**

Dr. Naoum will preside over the Liturgy of Ordination. He is the Primate of the Anglican Province of Jerusalem and the Middle East, in which the Diocese of Cyprus and the Gulf is a member. Dr. Naoum is a Palestinian Christian, who has been influential in the response of the ecumenical body of the Patriarchs and Heads of Churches in Jerusalem to the current conflict in Israel-Palestine. With the Orthodox Patriarch Theophilos III of Jerusalem, Dr. Naoum consecrated the oil used in the anointing of King Charles III at his Coronation in 2023 and attended the ceremony.

#### The Two Co-consecrating Bishops:

The Right Reverend Dr. Robert Innes, Bishop in Europe, who lives in Belgium and is Chair of the Church of England's Faith and Order Commission and Vice-Chair of the Church of England's Council for Christian Unity.

The Right Reverend Richard Jackson, Bishop of Hereford, the bishop of the diocese in which Sean spent his ministry in England. He is also "Clerk of the Closet", head of the College of Chaplains of the Ecclesiastical Household of the King Charles III.

#### Also in attendance:

The Right Reverend Anthony Poggo, The Secretary General of the Anglican Communion, is from South Sudan and heads up the secretariat of the Anglican Communion, the third largest Christian denomination worldwide, of which the Province of Jerusalem and the Middle East is a part.

Archbishop Samy Fawzy Shehata, is the Primate of the Province of Alexandria, an Egyptian national, who was part of the Anglican delegation to COP27 in 2022 in Cairo.

The Right Reverend Anthony Ball, is Bishop of North Africa in the Anglican Province of Alexandria, Chairman of The Jerusalem and Middle Eastern Church Association (JMECA), and Canon of Westminster Abbey.

Obedient to the call of Christ and in the power of the Holy Spirit, they are to gather God's people and celebrate with them the sacraments of the new covenant. Thus formed into a single communion of faith and love, the Church in each place and time is united with the Church in every place and time.

#### THE PRESENTATION

The Bishop of Hereford, Archdeacon Christopher, Archdeacon Michael, Lay Members of the Vacancy-in-See Committee present, say together:

Most Reverend Father in God, Sean has been chosen to be Bishop of the Diocese of Cyprus and the Gulf. We present him to be ordained and consecrated to the office of bishop in the Church of God.

Archbishop Sean, I invite you to make the Declaration of Assent.

The Archbishop then reads the Preface to the Declaration of Assent.

#### THE PREFACE TO THE DECLARATION OF ASSENT

The Episcopal/Anglican Church in Jerusalem and the Middle East is part of the one, holy, catholic, and apostolic Church, worshipping the one true God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. It professes the faith uniquely revealed in the Holy Scriptures and set forth in the Catholic Creeds, which faith the Church is called upon to proclaim afresh in each generation. Led by the Holy Spirit, it has borne witness to Christian truth in its historic formularies, the Thirty-nine Articles of Religion, the Book of Common Prayer, and the Ordering of Bishops, Priests and Deacons. In the Declaration you are about to make, will you affirm your loyalty to this inheritance of faith as your inspiration and guidance under God in bringing the grace and truth of Christ to this generation and making him known to those in your care?

Bishop-Elect: I, Sean Alexander John Semple, Clerk in Holy Orders about to be admitted and consecrated to the Bishopric and See of Cyprus and the Gulf in the Province of Episcopal/Anglican Church in Jerusalem and the Middle East, do so affirm, and accordingly declare my belief in the faith which is revealed in the Holy Scriptures and set forth in the catholic creeds and to which the historic formularies of the Episcopal/Anglican Church in the Province of Jerusalem and the Middle East bear witness; and in public prayer and administration of the sacraments, I will use only the forms of service which are authorised or allowed by Canon.

#### THE DECLARATION OF ASSENT TO THE CONSTITUTION

Archbishop Will you uphold the Constitution of this Diocese and of our Province?

I, Sean Alexander John Semple, Clerk in Holy Orders about to be admitted and consecrated to the Bishopric and See of Cyprus and the Gulf in the Province of Episcopal/Anglican Church in Jerusalem and the Middle East, do declare my assent to the Constitution of the said Episcopal/Anglican Church, and to the Constitution of the Diocese of Cyprus and the Gulf of that Church, and make known my intention in all my actions to be guided by those Constitutions as they now are or as they shall at any time be amended by authority. Moreover, I hereby take my Oath of Canonical Obedience to the Central Synod of the Episcopal/Anglican Church in Jerusalem and the Middle East, as exercising the metropolitical authority within that Church; and I declare my intention to serve loyally those who shall be set over me in the Church, to submit to their decisions if any Canonical proceedings are taken against me, and at all times to give good heed to their instructions and godly admonitions. So help me God.

Sermon

The Rt Rev'd Richard Jackson, Bishop of Hereford

#### The Creed

All We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen. We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father,

#### The Liturgy of Ordination

#### The Declarations

The Bishop-Elect stands before the Archbishop and consecrating bishops.

The Archbishop addresses the congregation

Bishops are called to serve and care for the flock of Christ. Mindful of the Good Shepherd, who laid down his life for his sheep, they are to love and pray for those committed to their charge, knowing their people and being known by them. As principal ministers of word and sacrament, stewards of the mysteries of God, they are to preside at the Lord's table and to lead the offering of prayer and praise. They are to feed God's pilgrim people, and so build up the Body of Christ.

#### Bishop Anthony Poggo:

They are to baptize and confirm, nurturing God's people in the life of the Spirit, and leading them in the way of holiness. They are to discern and foster the gifts of the Spirit in all who follow Christ, commissioning them to minister in his name. They are to preside over the ordination of deacons and priests, and join together in the ordination of bishops.

#### Bishop Robert:

As chief pastors, it is their duty to share with their fellow presbyters the oversight of the Church, speaking in the name of God, and expounding the gospel of salvation. With the Shepherd's love, they are to be merciful, but with firmness; to minister discipline, but with compassion. They are to have a special care for the poor, the outcast

and those who are in need. They are to seek out those who are lost and lead them home with rejoicing, declaring the absolution and forgiveness of sins to those who turn to Christ.

#### Bishop Richard:

Following the example of the prophets and the teaching of the apostles, they are to proclaim the gospel boldly, confront injustice and work for righteousness and peace in all the world.

The Archbishop addresses the Bishop-Elect directly

Sean, we trust that you have weighed and pondered all this, and that you are now fully determined to devote yourself to this ministry to which God has called you. We pray that you may offer to him your best powers of mind and spirit, so that as you follow the rule and teaching of our Lord you may grow up into his likeness, and sanctify the lives of all with whom you have to do. And now, in order that we may know your mind and purpose, you must make the declarations we put to you.

Will you teach the doctrine of the Christian faith as the Episcopal/Anglican Church in Jerusalem and the Middle East has received it, will you refute error, and will you hand on entire the faith that is entrusted to you? *Bishop-Elect* **By the help of God, I will.** 

The Rev'd Gill Nisbet, Head of the House of Clergy:

Will you be faithful in ordaining and commissioning ministers of the Gospel? *Bishop-Elect* **By the help of God, I will.**

The Bishop-Elect turns to face the Archbishop, who continues Sean, remember always with thanksgiving that God has entrusted to your care Christ's beloved bride, his own flock, bought by the shedding of his blood on the cross.

You are to govern Christ's people in truth, lead them out to proclaim the good news of the kingdom, and prepare them to stand before him when at last he comes in glory.

Bishop Richard:

You cannot bear the weight of this calling in your own strength, but only by the grace and power of God.

Archbishop Samy:

Pray therefore that you may be conformed more and more to the image of God's Son, so that through the outpouring of the Holy Spirit your life and ministry may be made holy and acceptable to God. Pray earnestly for the gift of the Holy Spirit.

After a red cover is spread in the pre-sanctuary, the Bishop-Elect prostrates himself and the congregation kneels/sits and bows their heads, and silence is kept. The Archbishop chants:

#### The Ordination Prayer

The Bishop-Elect rises and stands to one side. The red cloth is removed, and the Bishop-Elect proceeds to kneel at the entrance of the Sanctuary before the Archbishop and the gathered consecrating bishops. The Archbishop prays:

We praise and glorify you, almighty Father, because in your infinite love you have formed throughout the world a holy people for your own possession, a royal priesthood, a universal Church.

Bishop Anthony Poggo:

We praise and glorify you because you have given us your only Son Jesus Christ the image of your eternal and invisible glory, the firstborn of all creation and head of the Church.

#### Bishop Robert:

We praise and glorify you that by his death he has overcome death; and that, having ascended into heaven, he poured out your Holy Spirit upon his disciples, to give them power to preach the gospel to the ends of the earth, and to build up your people in love.

#### Archbishop:

And now we give you thanks that you have called this your servant, whom we ordain in your name, to share as a bishop in the ministry of the gospel of Christ, the Apostle and High Priest of our faith, and the Shepherd of our souls.

Therefore, Father, through Christ our Lord we pray:

The Archbishop and the consecrating bishops lay hands on the head of the Bishop-Elect.

The Archbishop prays

Send down the Holy Spirit on your servant Sean for the office and work of a bishop in your Church.

The Archbishop then continues

Through your Spirit, heavenly Father, fill this your servant with the grace and power which you gave to your apostles, that as a true shepherd he may feed and govern your flock, and lead them in proclaiming the gospel of your salvation in the world.

#### Bishop Richard:

Make him steadfast as a guardian of the faith and sacraments, wise as a teacher and faithful in presiding at the worship of your people.

#### Archbishop Samy:

Through him, with his fellow-servants in Christ, increase your Church and renew its ministry, uniting its members in a holy fellowship of truth and love. Give him humility, that he may use his authority to heal, not to hurt; to build up, not to destroy.

#### Archbishop of Jerusalem:

Defend him from all evil, that he may, as a faithful steward, be presented blameless with all your household and, at the last, enter your eternal joy, through your Son Jesus Christ our Lord, to whom, with you and your Holy Spirit, belong glory and honour, worship and praise, now and for ever. *All* **Amen.** 

#### The Anointing

The Archbishop anoints with the oil of Chrism:

May God, who anointed the Christ with the Holy Spirit at his baptism, anoint and empower you to bring good news to the poor, to proclaim release to the captives, to set free those who are oppressed and to proclaim the acceptable year of the Lord.

#### **Organ Music**

Bishop Sean stands and moves with the Dean to the pre-sanctuary. The Bishop faces the congregation. Those bearing the symbols of episcopal office gather, in order, in the central nave aisle, and process to the step of the pre-sanctuary at their turn to present.

Bishop Sean: With all my heart, I receive them.

#### Giving of the Episcopal Ring

A member of the Cathedral's Mother's Union (Mrs Jacqueline Jeff & Mrs Kelly Adjei-Admas): Take this ring, the seal of your fidelity. With faith and love protect the bride of Christ, his holy Church.

#### **Giving of the Pectoral Cross**

The Bishop of Hereford

May the Lord defend you against the assaults of the devil by
the power of his holy cross. As you bear this cross, so may
you ever keep in mind the memory of the Passion and the

victory of the martyrs.

The Rev'd Canon Chris Butt, Chairman of the Friends of the Diocese of Cyprus & the Gulf Jesus said, 'Take my yoke upon you and learn of me.' Wear this stole as a token of your obedience to Christ, whose yoke is easy and whose burden is light.

#### Giving of the Chasuble

The Reverends Prem Mitra & Mark Derry, clergy of the Diocese. St Paul says 'As many as have been baptized into Christ have put on Christ.' Wear this chasuble as a sign that you are clothed with Christ, in whose strength alone you stand among us.

#### Giving of the Mitre

By the Secretary General of the Anglican Communion, The Rt Rev'd Anthony Poggo St Luke tells us that at Pentecost tongues of flame rested on each one of the Apostles. Wear this mitre as a sign that the Holy Spirit rests upon you, and is to be your guide and wisdom in all things.

#### Giving of the Pastoral Staff (Crozier)

Children from the Cathedral communities present the Pastoral Staff

Bishop Sean, you are our chief shepherd. Carry this staff as a sign of your care for us in Christ. May the Lord be your Shepherd always.

#### **Liturgy of Installation**

**Processional Hymn: Tell out my Soul** (Tune: Woodlands; Words: Walter Greatorix) Bishop Sean, the Archdeacons of Cyprus & the Gulf leave the Cathedral using the south door and the west door of the Cathedral is closed. The Dean and Cathedral Canons process to the west door.

#### THE WELCOME

Bishop Sean, attended by the Archdeacons shall then approach the West Door. He shall strike the door three times with his staff, saying:

Open to me the gates of righteousness;
that I may enter and give thanks to the Lord.

The door shall then be opened, and the Dean, addressing Bishop Sean, shall say: Who comes in the name of the Lord?

*Bishop Sean* I, Sean, by Divine Providence, duly elected and consecrated as Bishop of the Diocese of Cyprus and the Gulf, ask you to admit me to my place as Bishop in this Cathedral Church.

The Dean Reverend Father in God, in the name of the Holy and Undivided
Trinity, on behalf of the people of your Diocese

Representative of the Government: and with the gracious hospitality of King Hamad bin Isa Al Khalifa and the people of Bahrain in their vision of peaceful coexistence,

Together: we welcome you into your Cathedral Church.

(Nurahibu bikum fi ardh at-ta'ayush wa as-salam)

(We welcome you to the land of coexistence and peace.)

All (with a loud voice): In the name of the Lord, we welcome you!

We welcome you!

Bishop Sean: و عليكم السلام. أهلا بكم. (Wa alaykum assalam. Ahlan bekum.)
I greet you in peace.

We greet the new bishop with applause.

#### Processional Music: Anton Bruckner, Ecce Sacerdos Magnus (organ)

The Bishop shall be conducted to the step of the Sanctuary, where the Provincial Mandate for the Installation is handed to the Dean. The Bishop is then led by the Dean to the Bishop's throne (cathedra), and the Dean, taking the Bishop's right hand, shall place him on the throne and say:

By virtue of the Provincial Mandate, I, Richard Fermer, Dean of St Christopher's Anglican Cathedral, in the Kingdom of Bahrain, do install you, Sean Alexander John Semple, into the Chair Episcopal of this Cathedral Church, and I induct you into the possession of the Bishopric of Cyprus and the Gulf with its rights and dignities and all its opportunities for service in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

May the Lord preserve your going out and your coming in from this time forth for evermore.

All: Amen.

Dean: Hear these words from an early Christian saint of these lands: "As a handful of sand thrown into the ocean, so are the sins of all flesh in comparison with the mercy of God. Therefore, be persecuted, but persecute not; be crucified, but crucify not; be wronged, but wrong not; be slandered, but slander not. Have clemency, not zeal, with respect to evil. Lay hold of goodness, not legality. The person who lives in love reaps the fruit of life from God, and while yet in this world, even now breathes the air of the resurrection."

(St Isaac of the Isles, otherwise known as St Isaac of Nineveh, was born in this region c.613 CE.)

#### THE DEDICATION TO PARTNERSHIP IN MINISTRY

The Bishop stands at the Sanctuary step.

Bahraini dignitaries are invited to come forward.

The Bishop says

His Majesty King Hamad bin Isa Al Khalifa

has written in the Declaration of the Kingdom of Bahrain,

"Faith illuminates our Path to Peace".

I offer you my support for this vision of peaceful co-existence of peoples and faiths.

The Bahraini dignitaries reply

His Majesty has said "Ignorance is the Enemy of Peace, it is therefore, our duty to learn, to share and to live together, by the Tenets of Faith in the spirit of mutual respect and love." We are your partners in peace.

Archdeacons, Clergy and Lay Readers of the Diocese gather on the pre-Sanctuary platform.

The Bishop addresses them:

My brothers and sisters,

clergy and lay readers of this Diocese,

as the Chief Pastor of the Diocese,

you participate in the cure of souls that has been given to me.

Without Christ I can do nothing.

To be fruitful we must edify one another in love.

I ask for your help in bearing the Office of Bishop of this Diocese.

The Clergy respond:

Through the grace of God the Father and supported by your prayers, we pledge ourselves to share in your ministry of pastoral care, and under your oversight, to pursue God's mission in this Diocese, working for unity in Christ, by following His commandment to love one another. May we bear you in our prayers and stand with you by our actions, in the name of Christ and in the power of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

Ecumenical Representatives of the Churches in Bahrain come forward into the pre-Sanctuary. The Bishop says:

I greet you brothers and sisters in Christ, from other churches in this Kingdom and region.

Our Lord Jesus has called us to become completely one, so that the world may know that the Father has sent His Beloved Son and has loved His disciples even as the Father has loved the Son. (John 17.23) I make my commitment to Christ's vision of unity.

Together they say

As leaders of the Church in this Kingdom and region, supported by the prayers of God's holy people, we pledge ourselves to work and pray together in God's mission and to be drawn into unity in Christ; whilst respecting those of other faiths, and affirming the peaceful co-existence of peoples in this Kingdom; in the power of the Holy Spirit, to the glory of God the Father.

Amen.

Leaders of other faiths join the Christian leaders as the Bishop says:

I welcome leaders of other faith traditions as partners in the common good.

Let us together pledge, Christian and non-Christian, to "harness the enormous power of collective faith to unite a world in peace" (Declaration of the Kingdom of Bahrain).
