Prayer & readings for today

Collect - Almighty God, give us grace to cast away the works of darkness and to put on the armour of light, now in the time of this mortal life, in which your Son Jesus Christ came to us in great humility; that on the last day, when he shall come again in his glorious majesty to judge the living and the dead, we may rise to the life immortal; through him who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen**

First Reading (Reader: A reading from the letter of Paul to the Romans.)

Besides this, you know what time it is, how it is now the moment for you to wake from sleep. For salvation is nearer to us now than when we became believers; the night is far gone, the day is near. Let us then lay aside the works of darkness and put on the armour of light; let us live honourably as in the day, not in revelling and drunkenness, not in debauchery and licentiousness, not in quarrelling and jealousy. Instead, put on the Lord Jesus Christ, and make no provision for the flesh, to gratify its desires. [Romans 13: 11-end]

Reader: This is the word of the Lord. All: **Thanks be to God**

Gospel Reading - 'But about that day and hour no one knows, neither the angels of heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father. For as the days of Noah were, so will be the coming of the Son of Man. For as in those days before the flood they were eating and drinking, marrying and

giving in marriage, until the day Noah entered the ark, and they knew nothing until the flood came and swept them all away, so too will be the coming of the Son of Man. Then two will be in the field; one will be taken and one will be left. Two women will be grinding meal together; one will be taken and one will be left. Keep awake therefore, for you do not know on what day your Lord is coming. But understand this: if the owner of the house had known in what part of the night the thief was coming, he would have stayed awake and would not have let his house be broken into. Therefore you also must be ready, for the Son of Man is coming at an unexpected hour. [Matthew 24. 36-44]

Letter from John

The Advent Course, 2025: Some years ago, a distinguished author wrote a book called 'What prevents Christian adults from learning?'. It wasn't an easy read. But it did highlight the inertia that can build up in churches and worshipping communities around exploring the faith. People too easily remember a few highlights from confirmation classes, a book they read long ago, and the odd theme from a sermon. And that's it. Yes, people who nowadays come to church do so often out of a very deep intuition and with a great loyalty to God and the church. And that is impressive and even noble. But often this core belief isn't explored, and questions remain buried and unanswered. So, how brilliant last Sunday to see over thirty people gathered in St Mary's Hall to explore the question, what can we believe today about life beyond this life. After some hospitality, there was a presentation (music and poetry), then a short discussion in small groups, and then a host of really good questions. This week we will look at images of divine judgement, and we'll tackle some tricky questions including: is purgatory plausible, and are all finally saved? Each session is free standing, so if you couldn't make it last week, you'll be very welcome this week: Sunday, 3pm (chosen as a better time), tea from 2.30pm, all in St Mary's Hall. John Davies
