Prayer & readings for today

Collect - Almighty God, in Christ you make all things new: transform the poverty of our nature by the riches of your grace, and in the renewal of our lives make known your heavenly glory; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen.**

First Reading (*Reader: A reading from The First Letter of Paul to the Corinthians*) Paul, called to be an apostle of Christ Jesus by the will of God, and our brother Sosthenes, To the church of God that is in Corinth, to those who are sanctified in Christ Jesus, called to be saints, together with all those who in every place call on the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, both their Lord and ours: Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ. I give thanks to my God always for you because of the grace of God that has been given you in Christ Jesus, for in every way you have been enriched in him, in speech and knowledge of every kind—just as the testimony of Christ has been strengthened among you—so that you are not lacking in any spiritual gift as you wait for the revealing of our Lord Jesus Christ. He will also strengthen you to the end, so that you may be blameless on the day of our Lord Jesus Christ. God is faithful; by him you were called into the fellowship of his Son, Jesus Christ our Lord. [1 Corinthians 1: 1-9]

Reader: This is the word of the Lord. **All: Thanks be to God**

Gospel Reading – The next day he saw Jesus coming towards him and declared, ‘Here is the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world! This is he of whom I said, “After me comes a man who ranks ahead of me because he was before me.” I myself did not know him; but I came baptizing with water for this reason, that he might be revealed to Israel.’ And John testified, ‘I saw the Spirit descending from heaven like a dove, and it remained on him. I myself did not know him, but the one who sent me to baptize with water said to me, “He on whom you see the Spirit descend and remain is the one who baptizes with the Holy Spirit.” And I myself have seen and have testified that this is the Son of God.’

The next day John again was standing with two of his disciples, and as he watched Jesus walk by, he exclaimed, ‘Look, here is the Lamb of God!’ The two disciples heard him say this, and they followed Jesus. When Jesus turned and saw them following, he said to them, ‘What are you looking for?’ They said to him, ‘Rabbi’ (which translated means Teacher), ‘where are you staying?’ He said to them, ‘Come and see.’ They came and saw where he was staying, and they remained with him that day. It was about four o’clock in the afternoon. One of the two who heard John speak and followed him was Andrew, Simon Peter’s brother. He first found his brother Simon and said to him, ‘We have found the Messiah’ (which is translated Anointed). He brought Simon to Jesus, who looked at him and said, ‘You are Simon son of John. You are to be called Cephas’ (which is translated Peter). [John 1: 29-42]

Letter from Derek

Do you recall those playground moments when teams were being selected for a football or netball game? I recall always being the last or penultimate to be picked because I know that I was never a skilful player and couldn’t always remember which way to kick when eventually the ball came my way. As time went on, I realised also that the two chosen captains were always the same lads and were the ‘bully boy’ teacher’s favourites in any physical activity -it just wasn’t fair!

I wonder how the disciples felt when the selection of the Jesus team was being made. Think of the situation and purpose of the team. Jesus knew the folk that he was asking to help him. After all he was then thirty and had known the lakeside community and the locals since his family had settled back into Nazareth. In so far as there was education it had been shared with the others attending the synagogue across the years. They knew each other’s families. They knew how each person had a place in society – and Jesus knew their personal characteristics and foibles.

Further, although Jesus had only just begun his ministry, the companions knew him as an individual, as a skilled carpenter, a man with strong family ties and, no doubt, a thinker, prepared to speak out against the personal and societal wrongs of the time.

Those who were willing to leave all the known in their world for the unknown with Jesus as one of his team, knew that saying 'yes' to Jesus was not a soft option – they were following a revolutionary. Do we willingly follow when, in different ways, we too feel that calling to take a revolutionary approach, or do we simply walk away from the team? Derek
